## **Question No. 18**

## Senator Abetz asked the following question at the hearing on 8 February 2010:

Regarding the Melbourne and Hobart registries:

- a. How many people are employed at the Melbourne registry to date?
- b. How many people are employed at the Hobart registry to date?
- c. What are the capital costs of any extra video linkages et cetera between Hobart and Melbourne?
- d. Have any travel allowance costs et cetera been incurred to date?

## The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

a. How many people are employed at the Melbourne registry to date?

As at 8 February 2010, there were 63 staff employed at the Melbourne Registry.

b. How many people are employed at the Hobart registry to date?

As at 8 February 2010, there were 6 staff employed at the Tasmania Registry.

c. What are the capital costs of any extra video linkages et cetera between Hobart and Melbourne?

The capital costs of any extra video linkages et cetera between Hobart and Melbourne is \$70.43.

d. Have any travel allowance costs et cetera been incurred to date?

The travel costs incurred for the period 1 July 2009 to 8 February 2010 for travel between Melbourne and Hobart are \$24,288.49. The travel was primarily undertaken by Registrars for mediations and court listings. Some travel was also undertaken by registry staff to provide assistance with staff training and other registry functions.
