ADDITIONAL BUDGET ESTIMATES HEARING: 21 FEBRUARY 2011

IMMIGRATION AND CITIZENSHIP PORTFOLIO

(81) Program 1.1: Visa and Migration

Senator Cash asked:

How many times did the Minister intervene to grant a visa? What type of visa was granted? What is the breakdown by country of origin? How does this compare to 2008/2009?

Answer:

The Minister has the power to intervene to grant visas under sections 195A, 345, 351, 391, 417, 454 and 501J of the *Migration Act 1958* (the Act).

There have been no grants through Ministerial Intervention (MI) under sections 345, 391, 454 and 501J of the Act during the specified period.

Below is information about visa grants through MI under sections 417, 351 and 195A of the Act¹:
