Dear Minister

I am writing to seek clarification on the current confusion surrounding the status of Bibles as "gifts" under the current Australian Citizenship Ceremonies Code. I refer also to recent communications I have had with the Bible Society of Tasmania who have serious concerns. I seek your confirmation that Bibles have not been - and will not be - banned at citizenship ceremonies.

In particular, I draw to your attention Hansard from Senate estimates on October 19 where I raised these concerns and the current issue surrounding the banning of Bibles as gifts at various citizenship ceremonies in Tasmania. Under questioning, a DIAC official stated that he did not believe gifts were banned under the current code. However, as highlighted in The Mercury on Friday, October 22 (Battle of the Bible giving, page 3), a DIAC spokesperson declared that Bibles are banned as gifts. Which is correct?


Many community groups, charities, and Non-Government Organisations, including the Bible Society, have continuously offered a range of gifts to new Australian citizens at citizenship ceremonies, all of whom have the choice to decide which gifts they would like to take home with them. This practice should continue.
