### **Question No. 88**

#### Senator Humphries asked the following question at the hearing on 14 February 2012:

#### Freedom of Information

- 1. Has the Department/agency received any advice on how to respond to FOI requests?
- 2. What was the total cost to the department to process FOI requests for 2009-10 and 2010-11?
- 3. What is the total cost to the department to process FOI requests for this financial year to date?
- 4. How many FOI requests did the Department receive for the financial year 2009-10 and 2010-11? For each financial year, how many requests were denied and how many were granted? Did the department fail to meet the processing times outlined in the FOI Act for any requests? If so, how many? Do any of these requests remain outstanding?
- 5. How many FOI requests has the Department received for this financial year to date? How many requests have been denied and how many have been granted? Has the department failed to meet the processing times outlined in the FOI Act for any requests? If so, how many? Do any of these requests remain outstanding?
- 6. How many conclusive certificates have been issued in relation to FOI requests for this financial year to date?

#### The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

- 1. Guidance on Freedom of Information (FOI) matters was provided to this, and all other Departments, in a letter in April 2009 from the then Cabinet Secretary, a letter in October 2010 from the then Minister for Privacy and Freedom of Information, guidelines issued by the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet (PM&C) prior to November 2010, guidelines issued after November 2010 by the Office of the Australian Information Commissioner and FOI Guidance notes issued by PM&C in July 2011. The Attorney-General's Department and its portfolio agencies have not received any advice this year on how to handle requests.
  - The Australian Government Solicitor and the Australian Security Intelligence Organisation are exempt from the operation of the *Freedom of Information Act 1982*. Therefore no advice on how to respond was sought or received by these two bodies.
- 2. Prior to 1 November 2010, the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* required the relevant Minister to present an annual report on the operation of the Act to Parliament, which included FOI costs. Details on FOI costs for 2009-10 can therefore be found at 'www.ag.gov.au/Freedomofinformation/Pages/Freedom-of-information-annual-reports.aspx'.
  - From 1 November 2010, section 30 of the *Australian Information Commissioner Act 2010* requires the Australian Information Commissioner to present an annual report on the operation of the Office of the Australian Information Commissioner (OAIC), which includes

FOI costs. Details on FOI costs for 2010-11 can therefore be found at 'www.oaic.gov.au/publications/reports/FOIAR 10-11/index.html'.

From 1 November 2010, section 30 of the *Australian Information Commissioner Act 2010* requires the Australian Information Commissioner to present an annual report on the operation of the Office of the Australian Information Commissioner (OAIC), which must include certain freedom of information matters.

- 3. This data is not yet readily available. The compiling and provision of this information would involve an unreasonable diversion of resources. Costs for 2011-12 will be included in the next FOI Annual Report to be published this year by the Office of the Australian Information Commissioner.
