2) There were two Australian Law Reform Commission reports commissioned by the Government this financial year to date:

### Age barriers to work

On 8 February 2012, the Attorney-General announced an inquiry into legal barriers to mature age persons participating in the workforce—namely for people aged 45 years and over.

Under the Terms of Reference, the ALRC is to identify these barriers and consider reforms to address them in Commonwealth laws, including: social security, superannuation, insurance, compensation and employment.

Age Discrimination Commissioner Susan Ryan has been appointed to the ALRC as a Part-time Commissioner to assist with the Inquiry.

Terms of Reference were received on 12 March 2012. The ALRC is due to report by the end of March 2013.

# Copyright

On 30 March 2012, Attorney-General released Draft Terms of Reference for the ALRC Copyright Inquiry.

The Government will consider all comments submitted during the consultation when finalising the terms of reference.

It is expected the Commission will be asked to report no later than 30 November 2013.
