Senator Humphries asked the following question at the hearing on 14 February 2012:

Provision of Equipment

Does the department/agency provide their Ministers and/or Parliamentary Secretaries and/or their offices with any electronic equipment? If yes, provide details of what is provided, the cost and to who it is provided.

What equipment is provided to department/agency staff? Please list what the equipment is, the cost, the classification of the staff receiving the equipment and the reason why.

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

- 1. The Attorney-General's Department provides various standard items of electronic equipment to Ministers and their staff as required based on a case by case basis, including:
 - Desktop PC (including monitors)
 - Laptop
 - Blackberry device (mobile phone)
 - Telstra wireless 4G/3G internet 'dongle'

In addition to standard items listed above, the following items of electronic equipment may be provided to ministers and their staff as required on a case by case basis:

- iPad (only made available to the Minister)
- Bluetooth headset/car speaker
- Desktop scanner or printer
- Digital voice recorder (available to the office rather than individual staff)
- Digital camera (available to the office rather than individual staff)
- 2. The Attorney-General's Department and Portfolio Agencies provide various standard items of electronic equipment to staff members as required based on a case by case basis, including:
 - Desktop PC (including monitors)

- Laptop
- Blackberry device (mobile phone)
- Telstra wireless 4G/3G internet 'dongle'

These items are provided to staff for the purposes of normal work practices. A breakdown of costs and staff classifications is not readily available. To attempt to provide this level of detail would involve an unreasonable diversion of resources.
