Senator Cash (L&CA 30) asked:

Please provide a breakdown on the prospective marriage visas that were cancelled or refused for the last five years in relation to all the grounds on which they can be cancelled or refused.

## Answer.

From 1 July 2007 a total of 473 Prospective Marriage visas were cancelled.

The below table illustrates the number of cancellations under each of the powers in each year from 2007/08 to 31/12/2011.
