What has been the cost of operating Christmas Island detention facilities in the year to date? Please provide a breakdown of those costs. How many asylum seekers are currently detained there? How many have been released on a bridging visa; into community detention or given a permanent visa?

• There were 703 Irregular Maritime Arrivals (IMAs) being accommodated on Christmas Island.

According to DIAC operational data, from 10 February 2011 to cob 13 February 2012:

- 105 IMAs were placed into community detention on the Australian mainland from Christmas Island;
- 483 IMAs were released on protection visas from Christmas Island; and
- Six IMAs had been released from Christmas Island immigration detention facilities on a bridging visa.
