## (AE12/0481) Program 2.1: Refugee and Humanitarian Assistance

Senator Cash asked:

Could I also get a breakdown over, say, the last five years of the number of people who have come to Australia under the offshore processing program and who are Christians from these (Middle East) countries?

## Answer.

During the last five financial years, 2006–07 to 2010–11, 5757 visas have been granted under the offshore component of Australia's Humanitarian Program to persons who self identified as Christian<sup>1</sup>, and who were born in countries in the Middle East<sup>2</sup>.

Below is a breakdown by year of visas granted to Christians born in the Middle East<sup>2</sup>.
