## <u>Grants</u>

- a) Could the department/agency provide a list of all grants, including ad hoc and one-off grants for this financial year to date? Please provide details of the recipients, the amount, the intended use of the grants and what locations have benefited from the grants.
- b) Have all grant agreement details been published on its website within the required timeframe? If not, provide details.
- c) Provide a list of grants that your department/agency administers that had uncommitted grants funding reduced as per the statement by the Finance Minister (FM) on 22 October 2012 (see <a href="http://www.financeminister.gov.au/media/2012/mr\_2102012.html">http://www.financeminister.gov.au/media/2012/mr\_2102012.html</a>). How much was funding reduced for grant?

- b) No. The Department has concluded internal certificate of compliance assurance processes for the 1st and 2nd quarters of 2012-13. The Department published 363 grants for the period 1 July 2012 to 31 January 2013 on its website within the required timeframe. A further 33 grants representing approximately 8.3 per cent of all grants were not published within the required timeframe. These 33 grants have been included on the AGD's website since 18 Feb 2013.
- c) The grants that Attorney-General's Department administers that had uncommitted grants funding reduced as per the statement by the Finance Minister on 22 October 2012 are:
- The *Grants to Australian Organisations Program* had its funding reduced by \$0.643 million.
