Senator HANSON-YOUNG: That is different to the question I have asked. Let me be clear. Will the terms of reference include analysis as to which countries the information was downloaded from and the IP addresses that equate to those?

Mr Bowles: It will identify the IP addresses. I will have to take on notice whether it actually goes to the countries, but—

*Answer:*

Yes, the scope of the KPMG report included who accessed the information and who may retain access to the personal information. Analysis of the Internet Protocol (IP) addresses accessing or downloading the data was included under this scope of the review.
