Senator O'Brien (L&C 96) asked:

How much did the review of the *Aboriginal Councils and Associations Act of 1976* cost?

Answer:

The review of the *Aboriginal Councils and Associations Act 1976* (the ACA Act) was conducted over the period February 2001 to December 2002, when the Final Report was released (the Final Report is accessible at www.orac.gov.au). The review involved consideration of the findings of previous reviews of the ACA Act, targeted consultation with Indigenous people, peak Indigenous bodies and a range of stakeholders, and thorough research on relevant issues. The total cost of the review was \$584,079.83. The Government subsequently announced its intention to reform the ACA Act and a reform Bill is currently being drafted.

A breakdown of the costs of the review follows:

1.	Independent assessment of tenders to undertake the review	\$ 1,990.00
2.	Consultants fees Corrs Chambers Westgarth, Lawyers, were engaged to undertake the review. They were contracted on 10 April 2001 and completed their work on 30 October 2002. The cost of review includes substantial consultation with Indigenous people and peak Indigenous bodies.	\$ 516,635.59
3.	Consultative Workshops Two workshops were held during the review to ensure that consultation was undertaken with a wide of range of interested stakeholders. Participants at the workshops were from a broadly representative cross-section of corporations incorporated under the Act, those incorporated under other legislative regimes, key Indigenous representative bodies, and a range of people from government agencies who have involvement in and experience with Indigenous corporations. Both workshops were held in Alice Springs. The first was held on 3-4 May 2001 and the second on 9-10 April 2002.	\$ 46,091.34
4.	Correspondence to all registered corporations and requests for submissions to the review via Indigenous radio and newspapers.	\$ 13,471.33
5.	Steering Committee Meetings	\$ 1,964.30
6.	Independent Legal Advice	\$ 3,927.27
