(127) Output 1.1: Migration and Temporary Entry

Senator Ludwig asked:

Based on the Department's own records what percentage of people on a skilled migration (independent stream) visa, are still working in that skilled stream after 3 months?

Answer:

While the Department does not have information on what proportion of skilled independent migrants are working in a skilled occupation <u>three</u> months after arrival, we do have information on how skilled independent migrants are faring after <u>six</u> months. This information comes from the Longitudinal Survey of Immigrants to Australia (LSIA).

The latest study, LSIA 3, surveyed 9,865 primary applicants who entered Australia in 2004-05 and found that after six months, 67% of skilled independent primary applicants were working in a skilled job. Our experience following previous cohorts of skilled migrants suggests that this percentage will increase steadily the longer the skilled migrants have lived in Australia.
