Question No. 158

Senator Ludwig asked the following question at the hearing on 24 May 2007:

- a) Are you able to indicate what criminal record or history checks are undertaken for members of staff who are applying
- i) Does this cover all staff permanent and temporary?
- b) Are you able to indicate during 2006-07 whether or not any staff have been dismissed as a result of a discovery of a criminal record or history?
 - i) If so:
 - 1) How was this discovered?
 - 2) Without identifying the person, give details as to the history?

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

- a) Consent to obtain personal information is completed at the commencement of employment with the Court. Questions on this form cover:
- a request for information regarding criminal/traffic charges, conviction or pecuniary penalties over the last ten years; details of permanent residential addresses over the preceding ten years as well as name/date and place of birth and other surnames used.
 - i) Permanent and temporary staff are required to complete the Consent to Obtain Personal Information form.
- b) No staff have been dismissed as a result of a discovery of a criminal record or history.
