Senator Fierravanti-Wells (L&CA 64) asked:

What was the nature of the incidents of self-harm in the detention centres?

Answer.

In the financial year 2008-09 year to date 30 April 2009 there have been 14 reported incidents of actual and attempted self harm.

Christmas Island Immigration Detention Centre

1. Client tightened a TV power cord around neck.

Maribyrnong Immigration Detention Centre

- 1. Client attempted self harm by using a piece of broken glass.
- 2. Client attempted self harm by knocking head against a window.

Perth Immigration Detention Centre

1. Client cut neck with a piece of broken glass.

Perth Immigration Residential Housing

1. Client swallowed an amount of toilet cleaner.

Villawood Immigration Detention Centre

- 1. Client stabbed wrist with a traditional bone carving pendant.
- 2. Client attempted to bang head against wall.
- 3. Client was on the roof of a building and threatened self harm by jumping off.
- 4. Client stabbed self with bread knife.
- 5. Client cut left wrist and then attempted to cut throat with a razor blade.
- 6. Client swallowed soap and water.
- 7. Client knocked head on floor with considerable force.

Brisbane Immigration Transit Accommodation

1. Client repeatedly punched self in the head.

Royal Adelaide Hospital - while under static guard

1. Client attempted to cut self by using a plastic knife.
