(57) Program 5.1: Settlement Services for Migrants and Refugees

Senator Fierravanti-Wells (L&CA 76) asked:

What work has been done in encouraging the settlement of humanitarian and refugee entrants into regional Australia? How many have been located in the regions and which regions?

Answer.

Over the past few years the Department has been working to encourage higher levels of humanitarian settlement in regional locations by establishing humanitarian settlement in new regional towns, including in:

- Queensland (Gold Coast, Toowoomba, Cairns and Townsville)
- Victoria (Geelong, Shepparton and Ballarat)
- New South Wales (Albury, Wagga Wagga, Coffs Harbour, Wollongong and Newcastle)
- Tasmania (Launceston) and
- South Australia (Mount Gambier, Murray Bridge).

It is important to note that the Department is limited in its ability to direct humanitarian entrants to regional locations. Most already have social 'links' in Australia, that is, family, friends or a proposer. In these cases, the Department seeks to settle the entrants near their links as they provide valuable social and settlement support, particularly in the early settlement period.

For entrants without any links (known as 'unlinked' refugees), the Department considers a range of factors when determining a suitable settlement location, including the specific needs of the individual or family, and the capacity of the receiving area to address those needs. For some of these entrants, regional towns can provide strong settlement prospects.

The following table represents humanitarian settlement in the regional areas listed. These figures are current as at 4 June 2009 and also capture direct settlement and internal migration and secondary movement numbers into these regional areas.
