# (42) Program 2.1: Refugee and Humanitarian Assistance

### Senator Parry (L&C 75-76) asked:

How many humanitarian refugee visas have been granted out of Indonesia and Malaysia from the caseload of asylum seekers processed by the UNHCR from 2008–09 until the year to date. What nationalities were they? What type of visa were they given?

#### Answer.

The following tables show the number of Refugee category<sup>1</sup> visas granted under the Humanitarian Program to persons in Indonesia and Malaysia by country of birth for the period 1 July 2008 (the beginning of the 2008–09 Program year) to 31 May 2010.
