Senator Cash (L&CA 115) asked:

How many travellers to Australia, over the last three years, have presented with false or altered documents?

Answer

Non-citizen travellers arriving at an air or sea port in Australia may be refused immigration clearance on a number of grounds, including for presenting inappropriate documentation to clearance officers. 'Inappropriately documented arrivals' refers to travellers who were refused immigration clearance at the border and who arrived

- without a travel document, or
- without a travel document that is in force, or
- with a bogus travel document, or
- with a travel document issued to someone else (impostor) or that has been fraudulently altered,

as well as travellers who were refused immigration clearance, who arrived on a genuine passport without a visa in effect and who were not granted a visa in clearance.
