Senator Cash (L&CA 70) asked:

How much are detainees paying in equivalent credits for cigarettes? Does that figure include a retail GST component as opposed to a lower GST component, based on bulk purchasing arrangements, and excise duty? Are you able to advise on that?

Answer.

People in immigration detention are able earn Individual Allowance Points for participation in activities. These points can be used to purchase a range of products including chocolate, chips and soft drinks, as well as cigarettes, if the person is 18 or older. The Points-equivalent cost of cigarettes for people in immigration detention is the same as the standard cost of cigarettes at that location, including all applicable taxes and duties.
