Is it the case that DIAC officers assess each application for a refugee visa prior to the visa being granted? Is that how it operates?

Ms Larkins: Yes, that is right.

Senator FURNER: How long does that process normally take?

Ms Larkins: I do not think I have an average time with me. I could come back to you on that. In terms of the offshore programs, I do not have an average time.
