## Senator Ludwig asked the following question at the hearing on 31 October 2005:

For the period 12 October 2005 to 31 October 2005, specify;

- a) how many sea import cargo clearances were granted for each day
- b) the average length of processing time for cargo clearances each day
- c) how many were performed through COMPILE
- d) how many were performed through ICS
- e) how many were performed through CCF
- f) how many were performed manually
- g) how many staff were engaged in processing cargo clearances each day

## The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

- a) See table below.
- b) See table below.
- c) 18, 435 sea import clearances were performed through COMPILE during this period.
- d) The following table contains the processing numbers for ICS EDI messages and elapsed time between the required payment for goods being received into the Customs system to the time the associated clearance message (informing the client of the clearance of the cargo) leaves Customs. Self-assessed air cargo reports are not included in these figures.

- e) All sea import clearances that were granted through the ICS were communicated through the CCF Gateway.
- f) During this period, manual clearances were performed by Customs officers in all states and territories as requested and required. Collation of these requests has not yet been undertaken and it is not possible to provide this statistic.
- g) It is not possible to determine how many individuals were involved in the processing of air import declarations during this period.
