## **Question No. 294**

## Senator Ludwig asked the following question at the hearing on 31 October 2005:

- a) What is the timeframe for the redeployment in Papua New Guinea?
- b) How many officers will be deployed? Will these officers be sworn or unsworn?
- c) What is the cost of the deployment?
- d) Where in PNG will the officers be deployed to?
- e) Will there be a joint command structure?
  - (i) If so, could the AFP provide a diagram or information regarding the structure of the joint command chain?
  - (ii) If not, why not?
- f) Was a joint command structure considered prior to the last deployment?
  - (i) If not, why not
  - (ii) If so, why was it not implemented? If it was not deemed suitable, please provide reasons.
