Senator Hurley asked:

1. At the moment according to DIMIA annual report 2004-2005, 75% of human entrants are from Africa how many interpreters and translators are enrolled for these new emerging languages in NAATI's accreditation program?
2. Which emerging community groups are been involved in this program?

Answer:

NAATI is not an agency of DIMIA. It is a company limited by guarantee operating in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001*. The Commonwealth and State/Territory Ministers responsible for multicultural and/or ethnic affairs are the Members of NAATI. NAATI is managed by a Board of Directors who exercise all the powers of the Company, as authorised by law, and the NAATI Constitution including making decisions on NAATI processes, accreditation and testing standards, administrative procedures, and quality control measures.

As a member of NAATI, the Commonwealth provides funding to NAATI in accordance with the NAATI Funding Agreement 2003 – 2006.
