Answer:

The following tables provide visa grants by subclass and citizenship for grants made in the period 18 June to 31 October 2005 to applicants for further protection. Please note that these figures include some visa grants made to applicants for further protection who were outside the cohort of applicants covered by the Prime Minister's commitment to finalise existing applications for permanent protection visas by temporary protection visa and temporary humanitarian visa holders by 31 October 2005. For example, grants following a remittal by the Refugee Review Tribunal. Data is as at 4 November 2005.

Citizenships, where there are fewer than 10 grants, have been aggregated and the number of citizenships is shown in brackets.
