# (123) Program 1.1: Visa and Migration

### Senator Back asked:

# Subclass 457 visa program - English language proficiency

If the English proficiency test changes were in effect for chef and head chef positions from 2 June to 13 September:

- a) how many applications have satisfied the requirements for a language exemption; and
- b) please provide numbers of applications lodged and approved in the four months prior and after this change.

### Answer.

a) English language proficiency was introduced to the Subclass 457 visa program on 1 July 2007 and applies to all primary applicants of Subclass 457 visa, requiring the primary applicant to demonstrate English language proficiency to the equivalent of average band score of IELTS 4.5 in the four test components, unless the primary applicant is exempt.

The English language proficiency requirement was amended on 14 April 2009 to increase the IELTS score from 4.5 to 5. The amendment also removed the exemption from Chefs and Head Chefs so that the English language proficiency requirement also applied to new visa applications from 14 April 2009 where the applicant's nominated occupation was Chef or Head Chef.

The number of Subclass 457 primary visa applications lodged between 14 April 2009 and 13 September 2009 where the nominated occupation is ASCO 3322-11 Chef or ASCO 3322-01 Head Chef and by exempt citizenship country for IELTS and the exempt nominated salary is shown in the table below.
