# (243) Program 2.1: Refugee and Humanitarian Assistance

### Senator Cash asked:

- (1) What is the RSA primary acceptance rate of all IMAs arriving in Australia by country of origin and nationality for applications considered post April 9, 2010?
- (2) How does this compare with the previous six month period?
- (3) What is the current acceptance rate after appeal for each group by country of origin?

#### Answer.

(1) Between 9 April 2010 and 27 October 2010, a total of 2062 primary RSAs were finalised. Of these, 655 people were found to be refugees and 1407 people were found not to be refugees. This is a primary acceptance rate of 27%.

(2) Between 9 October 2009 and 8 April 2010, a total of 1516 primary RSAs were finalised. Of these, 1389 people were found to be refugees and 127 people were found not to be refugees. This is a primary acceptance rate of 92%.

(3) This information is not available as not all of the review outcomes for cases considered in these periods have been finalised.
