Labour Agreements: How many onshore and offshore applications for General Skilled Migration are currently with the Department of Immigration & Citizenship? How long are they taking to process? Onshore and offshore by post?

Answer:

General Skilled Migration (GSM) is processed onshore in Adelaide and Brisbane.

General Skilled Migration visa applications, except for Temporary Skilled Graduate (subclass 485) visas, are subject to priority processing. This is the order in which the Department considers skilled migration applications.
