Senator Hanson-Young asked:

Malaysia Solution: How many Afghan refugees, many who have been in protracted exile for 4-5 years were approached for resettlement? If none, why? What was the process and how were decisions made over who would be approached for Australian resettlement?

Answer.

Consistent with longstanding arrangements, the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) refers to Australia refugees which UNHCR consider are a priority for consideration for resettlement.

We do not have data for the number of refugees considered by UNHCR for resettlement but from I July 2011 to 30 September 2011 the Australian High Commission, Kuala Lumpur granted 368 refugee visas, 18 of which were to Afghan refugees.
