- 1)Provide details of any update of the department/agency electricity purchasing agreement if there has been a change since Budget Estimates 2011-12 (May 2012).
- 2) What are the department/agency electricity costs for 2011-12?
- 3) What are the department/agency electricity costs for this financial year to date?

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

Attorney-General's Department

1)No change.

2)2011-12: \$937,000

3)1 July 2012 - 30 September 2012: \$183,000

Australian Crime Commission

- 1) No change.
- 2) 2011-12: \$479,637
- 3) 1 July 2012 30 September 2012: \$102,598

Australian Customs and Border Protection Services

- 1) No change.
- 2) The cost of electricity purchased directly from retailers and landlords where electricity charges have been identified separately for 2011-12 was \$3,996,901.07. Electricity costs passed through but not identified separately by landlords in relation to lease costs have not been included, as these are not recorded separately from other landlord costs in our Financial Management Information System.
- 3) The cost of electricity purchased directly from retailers and landlords where electricity charges have been identified separately for this financial year up to 30 September 2012, was \$1,034,807.16. Electricity costs passed through but not identified separately by landlords in relation to lease costs have not been included, as these are not recorded separately from other landlord costs in our Financial Management Information System.

Australian Security Intelligence Organisation

1) For all ACT facilities, the Organisation's electricity purchasing agreement aligns with the Whole-of-Government agreement negotiated by the Department of Defence in 2011 with ERM appointed as the provider for a term of three years. ASIO has an individual account with ERM established in accord with the terms and conditions of the Whole-of-Government agreement.

For ASIO's other facilities in Australia, ASIO has aligned itself with each of the respective Landlord's electricity providers under their terms and conditions. ASIO believe this method provides the best value for money as it benefits from the larger purchasing power of

each respective Landlord. These offices are all undeclared sites and ASIO does not provide comment on them for security reasons.

CrimTrac

- 1) CrimTrac transferred its office electricity services from ACTEW AGL to ERM on 1 July 2012 as part of a whole of government electricity contract.
- 2) For 2011-12, electricity costs were \$70,930 (excluding GST) for office electricity and \$60,647 (excluding GST) for data centre electricity.
- 3) For 2012-13, September YTD office electricity costs were \$19,540 (excluding GST) for office electricity and \$19,671 (excluding GST) for data centre electricity.

Family Court of Australia

1) The Family Court of Australia (FCoA) have a number of electricity purchasing agreements across a property portfolio of 21 sites. Some smaller privately leased sites (between 250 - 1200m²) have electricity provided via lease outgoings or do not currently have contracts in place as value for money cannot be realised via a contract (this has been tested).

Federal Court of Australia
