## Question No. 79

## Senator Brandis asked the following question at the hearing on 16 October 2012:

In relation to the People Smuggling Strike Team:

- 1. What is the current amount of funding allocated per year for the People Smuggling Strike Team?
- 2. How many staff are in the People Smuggling Strike Team? Has this number changed over the past twelve months? And over the past three years?
- 3. Where are the staff located?
- 4. Is the People Smuggling Strike Team involved with the anti-people smuggling campaign run by Customs? If yes what is the involvement?

## The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

1. The Combined People Smuggling Strike Team funding for 2012-2013 is \$7.2 million. This includes \$4.6 million from AFP core funding and \$2.6 million from the 2009-2010 budget measure.

The People Smuggling Strike Team funding for 2013-2014 is \$4.7 million.

- 2. People Smuggling Strike Team Staffing figures for the past four years are as follows:
  - 27 September 2012 108 members
  - 27 September 2011 87 members
  - 27 September 2010 71 members
  - 27 September 2009 41 members
- 3. The People Smuggling Strike Team is located in Canberra, Melbourne and Sydney. The People Smuggling Strike Team also deploys officers on a five week basis to Christmas Island.

The AFP employs a flexible investigations model which has the ability to deploy investigators across crime types and around Australia according to operational priorities.

4. The AFP is a member of the Whole of Government communications working group, which is led by Customs. Members of the AFP's National Media team represent the AFP on the working group.
