

## **QUESTION TAKEN ON NOTICE**

**SUPPLEMENTARY BUDGET ESTIMATES HEARING: 15 October 2012**

IMMIGRATION AND CITIZENSHIP PORTFOLIO

**(SE12/0410) PROGRAM – 4.1: Visa Compliance and Status Resolution**

Senator Hanson-Young (L&CA 92) asked:

Out of those 55 [who have been given adverse security assessments] how many are in family groups?

*Answer:*

Of the 55 persons who have been issued an adverse security assessment, as at 30 September 2012, there are a total of four family groups with immediate family (i.e. a partner/spouse and/or children) in Australia. This includes:

- Two parents (both of whom have been issued an adverse security assessment), with three children accommodated with them;
- One person with a non-citizen child accommodated with her;
- One person with two non-citizen children accommodated with her; and
- One person who has a spouse and child residing in the community.
