SUPPLEMENTARY BUDGET ESTIMATES HEARING: 15 October 2012

IMMIGRATION AND CITIZENSHIP PORTFOLIO

(SE12/0481) PROGRAM – 4.3: Offshore Asylum Seeker Management

Senator Cash (written) asked:

What was the cost of transporting asylum seekers (including the use of charter aircraft and buses, cars etc.) to and from Inverbrackie, including as a result of transfer from another centre, transfers for health and other appointments and outings? Please provide a breakdown of costs including the number of people involved for 2011-12. What are the budgeted costs for 2012-13?

Answer:

The costs for transporting asylum seekers out of the Inverbrackie Immigration Detention Facility are presented below. These costs are for the 2011-2012 financial year.

Commercial Travel	\$261 454
Charters	\$369 287
TOTAL	\$630 741

The reported expenses reflect flights transferring clients between centres, and to and from medical and legal appointments, as well as flights, trains and buses to final settlement destinations.

Local outings are provided by our contracted service providers. Associated costs are covered by larger contractual arrangements.

Costs for transporting asylum seekers into the centres are not officially recorded as this is reflected in the outgoing costs for the centre they have been transferred from.

Information relating to client and escorts numbers is not readily available for the 2011-2012 financial year and an unreasonable degree of effort would be required to extract this information from official records.

A budget estimate for 2012-2013 for specific transfers into and out of Inverbrackie is not available.
