(SE12/0501) PROGRAM – 4.3: Offshore Asylum Seeker Management

Senator Cash (written) asked:

Leonora: How many asylum seekers are currently detained there by length of time, age, gender and country of origin? How many have been released on a bridging visa, gone into community detention or been given a permanent visa? What is the budgeted cost to maintain and operate the centre in 2012-13?

Answer:

As at cob 15 October 2012:

 The number of irregular maritime arrivals (IMAs) accommodated in Leonora Alternative Place of Detention (APOD) was 75.

Below is a breakdown by length of time in detention, age, gender and country of origin.

^{*} There have been two clients who have turned 18 since being accommodated at the Leonora APOD. Due to their vulnerabilities these clients were referred in October 2012 for possible placement in community detention.

According to DIAC operational data**;

During the period 11 May 2011 to cob 15 October 2012:

- 659 IMAs were placed into community detention from Lenora APOD;
- 85 IMAs were released on protection visas from Leonora APOD; and
- 3 IMAs were released from Leonora APOD on a bridging visa.

There is no specific budget allocated for Leonora APOD in the 2012-13 financial year.
