(SE12/0632) PROGRAM – 4.3: Offshore Asylum Seeker Management

Senator Cash (written) asked:

I refer to the answer given to BE12/0378 which details people currently in immigration detention that have been charged with a criminal offence. The answer states "At the time of answering there were 146 persons in immigration detention who have been charged with a criminal offence". The answer goes on to list the offences – which include murder, manslaughter, domestic violence, assault, molestation, sexual assault, indecent dealing of a boy under 14, indecent assault of a boy under 16, possess child abuse video, people smuggling, damage to Commonwealth property, possession with intent to sell or supply – and the list goes on. Please advise the numbers of people who have been charged with each offence listed in the response to BE12/0378.

Answer:

The number of people charged with each offence outlined in BE12/0378 is below. It is important to note that the numbers will total more than 146 as each individual may have been subject to a number of different charges. As some state/territory jurisdictions apply different terminology in relation to criminal charges that are similar in nature, charges have been grouped under similar offence type.
