- 1. Has the Attorney-General made any appointments of any court since becoming the Attorney in September 2013?
- 2. Are there any appointments on the horizon?
- 3. To the department, can you please outline the process for making court appointments?
- 4. Have there been any discussions about the process with the AG or appointments?
 - a) Has the attorney sought or been given a brief on the appointments process?
 - b) Does that brief match the evidence just been given?

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

- 1. No.
- 2. Yes.
- 3. Appointments to the federal courts are made by the Governor-General in Executive Council. The process for identifying suitable candidates for judicial appointment is a matter for the government of the day.
- 4. Yes.
 - a) Yes, judicial appointments processes were included in the Incoming Government Brief, noting that the process for identifying suitable candidates for judicial appointment is a matter for the government of the day.
 - b) Not applicable no evidence was given on this matter.
