Senator Hanson-Young (L&CA 47-48) asked:

Senator HANSON-YOUNG: From that 857 people who have been refused enter so far this financial year, do you have a breakdown of their nationalities? Mr Allen: I would have to take the nationality on notice.

Answer:

This financial year to 31 October 2013, 857 persons were refused entry on the grounds of suspect bona fides.

Below is a breakdown of the nationalities of the 857 clients refused immigration clearance because of bona fide concerns.
