Thank you, Chair; with your agreement, I would like to make some opening comments.

These will provide some context information for today's hearing particularly in relation to the recent machinery of government decisions that impact on the Department.

Machinery of government decisions and implications

The machinery of government decisions which took effect on 14 September 2010 have had a significant impact on the Department.

The Department's name has changed to the Department of Infrastructure and Transport. This is in recognition of the transfer of regional development and local government functions to the Department of Regional Australia, Regional Development and Local Government.

With these changes, the primary responsibilities set out in the Administrative Arrangements Orders for the Department include infrastructure planning and co-ordination, transport safety, land transport, civil aviation and airports, transport security, maritime transport, and the facilitation and implementation of all non-Defence major development projects.

The role of the Office of the Coordinator General will also soon transfer to the Department from the Prime Minister's portfolio. On 30 September 178 former employees, including 6 SES officers, of the Department transferred to the new Department of Regional Australia, Regional Development and Local Government. We have put in place arrangements to facilitate the establishment of the new Department and will continue to provide shared services to the new Department, particularly in relation to accommodation, finance and HR systems support.

The Department's organisation structure has been amended to reflect the transfer of the former Local Government and Regional Development Division and the Office of Northern Australia and a number of corporate support staff to the new Department.
