The total cost of the Cairns lease is \$713 400 for the first year, commencing 1 September 2009, with \$68 000 for car parking spaces.

The preferred provider represented the best value for money based on comparative assessment of the proposals and their extensive experience in executive search services in the Australian industry. The personnel nominated for the assignment had successfully completed over 400 SES and SES-equivalent recruitment assignments including a significant number at the SES Band 3 and CEO levels.

Commercial consignments of wooden articles which are identified as being of low biosecurity risk, including a wide range of manufactured articles such as furniture (excluding antiques), musical instruments and kitchen utensils, may not need to be physically inspected on arrival if an assessment of the accompanying documentation shows they have met Australia's import requirements

Where there is no evidence of acceptable treatment prior to arrival, consignments will be directed for inspection by AQIS officers and/or treatment by an approved treatment provider.
