Senator JOHNSTON—Could you take on notice how long it was that each of the aircraft were without their search radar and when search radars were installed in all aircraft?

Answer:

Aero Rescue contracts were signed on 2 November 2004 (Darwin) and 16 December 2005 (Perth/Cairns/Brisbane/Melbourne).

Radar was installed and implemented on each aircraft at the commencement of their service dates. Weather radar mode has been available from service commencement dates, enabling the aircraft to operate in all but the most extreme weather conditions.

However, the radar search mode of some aircraft has been affected by stability issues.
