

Senate Finance and Public Administration Legislation Committee Budget Estimates 2019-20 Monday, 8 April 2019 Daily summary

Here is the summary of today's proceedings in the Finance and Public Administration Legislation Committee estimates hearing.

The committee met from 9.00am to 6.52pm.
