To Senators on the Senate Select Committee on Climate Policy, Below is a sample submission prepared by The Greens. I endorse everything in it so am including it in my submission but I want to highlight the fact that I am particulary incensed by the fact that any efforts I make to reduce carbon emissions will only reduce the need for polluters to reduce their pollution. This is totally riduculous and a huge waste of the good effors of many Australians.

I am also incensed by the free permits to be given to carbon polluters. Any industry with forsight should have seen this issue coming and moved to reduce it's carbon emissions to benefit its shareholders and the community: instead many have sat back and are now lobbying for monay from people like me who are very committed to carbon reduction (I pay for 10% solar energy) to keep them pollutting. In business you have to move with the times and if you fail to do so that is your problem, not the taxpayers.

I think the target is way too low.

More needs to be done to stimulate alternative non-carbon emitting energy sources.
