IS IT NECESSARY AT ALL?

I wish to make the following submission to the Committee.

I note the terms of reference which include, inter alia, "any related matter".

It would appear the Committee is thus permitted to address the basic question of whether a "carbon pollution reduction scheme" is required at all.

My submission is simple.

- 1. There appears to be legitimate room for scientific debate about whether man-made carbon dioxide emissions are causing climate change or global warming;
- 2. whether climate change or global warming are good or bad things seems open to debate;
- 3. Australia with 21 million people among 6 billion on this earth is really not that important in the grand scheme of things anyway; but
- 4. imposing a carbon tax or emissions trading scheme will *certainly impose* costs on production and drive down Australian standards of living, especially if we are facing a global depression and cannot pass on extra costs to buyers of our wares; so

Why do anything until the science is proved **and** there is global agreement?

If it be argued that the science is indeed proved, I would note that -

- 1. Computer models are not scientific or experimental truth machines but simulations based on humanly-chosen parameters and inputs;
- 2. the choice of social discount rate is arbitrary; and
- 3. there are books and articles disputing the science (such as the attached) which do not seem to have been refuted as irrational.
