I am in full support of the Australian Greens Bill to repeal the Radioactive Waste Management Act 2005, and the amendments made in 2006 to the Radioactive Waste Management Act 2005. I am aware that the ALP has a mandate and obligation to repeal the Radioactive Waste Management Act 2005 as it was an ALP election promise during the 2007 Federal Election, it has been agreed by the ALP during the 2007 April ALP National Conference.
