<u>Inquiry into the Financial Sector Legislation Amendment (Enhancing Supervision and Enforcement) Bill 2009</u>

On 19 March 2009, the Senate referred the provisions of the Financial Sector Legislation Amendment (Enhancing Supervision and Enforcement) Bill 2009 to the Senate Standing Committee on Economics for inquiry and report by 7 May 2009.

The bill seeks to introduce measures to regulate non-operating holding companies (NOHCs) of life insurers and to harmonise the injunctions that may be issued in respect of prudentially regulated entities.
