

Inquiry into Tax Laws Amendment (Education Refund) Bill 2008

On 25 September 2008, the Senate referred the Tax Laws Amendment (Education Refund) Bill 2008 to the Senate Standing Committee on Economics for report by 13 October 2008.

The bill establishes the government's 'Education Tax Refund' whereby eligible families will be able to claim 50 per cent of eligible education expenses up to \$750 for each child undertaking primary school. This would provide a maximum tax offset of \$375 per child, per year. The tax offset will apply to eligible expenses incurred from 1 July 2008.
