Re: Senate Inquiry into the *Commonwealth Electoral* 

Amendment (Democratic Plebiscites) Bill 2007.

1. I would like to firstly place on record my support for the *Commonwealth Electoral Amendment (Democratic Plebiscites) Bill 2007.* I am of the opinion that the community should always have their voice heard on matters that will have a significant bearing on local communities. I believe that Forced Council Amalgamations will have an adverse effect on many communities in Flynn.

- 2. I advise the Committee that I am against forced council amalgamations. This has been both in my capacity as the Federal Candidate for Flynn and also as a proud Queenslander who values the importance of local government.
- 3. I commend the position that Federal Labor Leader Kevin Rudd has taken on this issue. Kevin Rudd, from the outset, made clear that a local choice and a local voice were vital for effective community representation. I am a person who values the input of the community and don't believe that they should ever be steamrolled over.

- 4. John Howard should be acknowledged for finally accepting the position that Kevin Rudd and I adopted as far back as May this year. Although his response in addressing this issue comes only weeks before an election, I do however acknowledge that it was the right decision for the Government to make.
- 5. In concluding, I support the *Commonwealth Electoral Amendment* (*Democratic Plebiscites*) *Bill 2007* as it is the only sure way to guarantee that the voice of Flynn residents will be heard loud and clear.
