I strongly oppose this bill "Plebiscite for an Australian Republic Bill 2008 No ..., 2008" and ask that it be withdrawn for the following key reasons

- 1) Our constitutional monarchy has provided a very workable constitution where power is vested in the crown which is responsible to the people of Australia and not the politicians. This stability this peace and unity, since 1901, we do not want to lose, by providing greater power to politicians.
