Dear Senator Scullion

Thank you for your correspondence of 12 May 2009 seeking information about six issues raised during the Select Committee on Regional and Remote Indigenous Communities' hearings at Hermannsburg (Ntaria) and Alice Springs.

Thank you also for your letter of 13 May 2009 in which the Committee requested information about the services and facilities present in the 73 communities that are subject to measures under the Northern Territory Emergency Response (NTER).

With respect to the above issues raised with the Committee I am advised that those concerning the APY Land Families project and new computers at Ntaria school relate to programs administered by the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations (DEEWR). I understand that DEEWR is responding directly to the Committee on these issues. Responses to other issues raised with the Committee are at **Attachment A**.

Some of the information on the services and facilities in 73 NTER communities that are of interest to the Committee are not routinely collected or reported by my Department at the community level. Information on other services and facilities are not collected by my Department as they are provided by the Northern Territory government or the new Shires and lie outside the Australian Government's NTER responsibilities.

In order to meet the Committee's request my Department has liaised extensively with relevant Australian and Northern Territory government agencies to compile a comprehensive range of information on services and facilities delivered through Australian Government funded programs, where these are delivered at the community level, as well as the majority of Northern Territory government delivered services.

Information was not readily available for a small number of data items requested by the Committee (for example dog control, road maintenance). These are delivered by the new Shires or Northern Territory government and lie outside the Australian Government's NTER responsibilities. Information on services and facilities in the NTER communities is at **Attachment B**.

I trust this information will be of assistance.

Question 1

While visiting Waltja Tjutangku Palyapayi in Alice Springs the committee was informed about the APY Lands Families project for which funding is due to expire on 30 June. Will funding for this program be continued?

The Department of Families, Housing Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FaHCSIA) has been advised that the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations (DEEWR) administer the program providing funding for the APY Lands Families project. DEEWR will be responding directly to the Committee regarding this issue.

Question 2

The committee was advised that Shire Councils in the NT are responsible for the maintenance and repairs on shire houses and facilities in communities but are unable to, when the house or facility is empty, charge rent to contractors or other visitors if they wish to use these facilities due to the five year lease arrangements. Is the department aware of the reasons for this?

- Numerous Shire Council facilities are located on land which is Indigenous owned (either as Aboriginal land or as a community living areas) and subject to a five-year lease held by the Commonwealth.
- In June 2008, FaHCSIA (the Department responsible for administering the five-year leases) authorised each Shire to use specified land and premises in five-year leased communities for local government purposes. FaHCSIA does not charge Shires any rent for use of the land. This authorisation does not allow the Shire to use the land and premises for commercial purposes or to charge rent to another party for their use of the land.
- Other than this authorisation, the Shires generally have no legal authority (such as a lease from the land owner) to support their occupancy of buildings in Indigenous communities. FaHCSIA believes that the Shire should not ordinarily be entering into commercial arrangements for the use of land and premises by others. We do, however, acknowledge that in some circumstances the charging of some outgoings (such as servicing and maintenance costs) might be appropriate. Such arrangements must be approved by FaHCSIA.
- This issue was raised with the Shires in a letter sent from FaHCSIA in December 2008. The letter outlined the Department's rationale and provided details of a contact in the Department.

Question 3

In Ntaria (Hermannsburg) people were confused as to why the ongoing negotiations over lease arrangements were delaying the building of houses in the community. What is the department's communication strategy for ensuring that people are informed about the leasing arrangements in Communities?

- Under the Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act 1976, Land Councils have a statutory role in the grant of any lease on Aboriginal land. Land Councils ensure that traditional owners have been identified, consulted and given consent, that other Aboriginal people affected have also been consulted, that the terms and conditions of the lease are reasonable and that legal requirements are fully addressed.

- The Northern Territory (NT) Chief Minister wrote to the Central Land Council (CLC) on 30 July 2008 requesting housing precinct leases over Hermannsburg, Yuendumu and Lajamanu. To ensure traditional owners were apprised of the full range of options at consultations, the Secretary of FaHCSIA wrote to the CLC on 18 September 2008 setting out the basis on which it would be prepared to enter into a whole-of-township lease for Hermannsburg. These letters each set out the key lease terms for the CLC to use in consultations with traditional owners and residents.
- Governments respect that it is primarily the role of Land Councils to communicate with land owners about leasing, so do not negotiate directly with Aboriginal land owners. However the requirement for secure tenure to underpin government investment in new housing and infrastructure is outlined in the broader Strategic Indigenous Housing and Infrastructure Program (SIHIP) communications strategy.

Question 4

In Ntaria the committee was asked about the process for selecting the 26 communities, 16 of which are in the Northern Territory, to receive new housing over the next 10 years. What was the process for choosing the 26 communities?

Under the National Partnership Agreement on Remote Indigenous Housing, the locations for housing and infrastructure investment in each jurisdiction will be agreed jointly between the Australian Government and the relevant state or territory government.

COAG has already agreed priority remote service delivery locations 15 of which are in the NT (details are provided at [Attachment A.1](#)). These were identified between the Commonwealth and the relevant State / NT government. The locations will also be locations for initial housing investment.

In identifying further priority locations for housing investment the Government will take into account the national principles for investment in remote locations agreed to as part of the National Partnership Agreement on Remote Service Delivery. These principles take into account:

- significant concentrations of population;
- anticipated demographic trends and pressures;
- the potential for economic development and employment; and
- the extent of pre-existing shortfalls in government investment in infrastructure and services.

In the NT, the priority communities are larger communities with high housing needs and where the greatest impact can be made with the available funds. The intention is to maximise the role of priority communities as service hubs. These communities will receive new houses, major housing upgrades and improved housing related infrastructure through the SIHIP.

In addition to those communities which will receive major capital works in the NT, a further 57 communities in the NT will receive housing refurbishments.

Of course, other communities and townships (beyond the Remote Service Delivery sites) will continue to receive government support and services.

Question 5

The committee would also like to know whether the Ntaria school has been approved for funding to purchase new computers through the National Secondary School Computer Fund. If the school has been approved how many computers will they receive funding for?

FaHCSIA has been advised that DEEWR administer the National Secondary School Computer Fund and will be responding directly to the Committee regarding this issue.

Question 6

The committee was advised that the department undertook a housing needs analysis of communities in the Northern Territory as part of the NTER. Can the committee be supplied with a copy of this analysis? Did the results of this analysis form part of the basis for the selection of the 26 communities to receive new housing?

- A detailed assessment of individual buildings occurred under the Community Clean Up (CCU) program. The main purpose of the data collection under CCU was to ensure that the Commonwealth Government met its responsibilities around safety of tenants, had a baseline of housing condition as close to the commencement of leases as possible and could provide data to inform future ongoing programs such as SIHIP and repairs and maintenance via the NT government. These reports run to many thousand pages and significant work would be required to provide the material in a format that would be useful to the committee.
- The decision on NT SIHIP priority communities and allocation of funding had already been made by the time the CCU data was compiled so it was not a factor in this decision process.

The Northern Territory Emergency Response (NTER) has provided extra resources to ensure children in communities and town camps have access to a good education.

There are an estimated 10,000 school-aged children in communities affected by the NTER. Of these, up to 2000 school-aged students are not enrolled and an estimated 2500 students are not attending school regularly enough to benefit from their education.

The Australian Government is providing:

- \$98.8m for an additional 200 teachers (50 new teachers each calendar year over 2008-2011) for remote schools in the Northern Territory over five years;
- 22 additional teachers have been recruited and placed in remote communities;
- A further 23 new teachers began an intensive pre-placement training program in November 2008, bringing the total number of teachers employed under this measure in 2008 to 45;
- \$6 million to the NT Government and \$1.7 million to the Catholic Education Office for additional classrooms; a total of 20 classrooms were constructed to be operational in Term 1 2009;
- A further \$2.6 million for six classrooms over 2008;
- Under the \$4.854 million Accelerated Literacy initiative, regionally based specialist teams worked with 45 remote community schools to provide professional development to teachers on site and in context in 2008;
- \$3.854 million to establish a Quality Teaching Package with a major focus on developing and training local Indigenous teaching staff;
- Three new boarding facilities in the Territory, the first to open in 2009 and the others in 2010. These will accommodate students from years 8 to 12 and help to give young people from remote areas access to a secondary education. The colleges will be linked to major sources of employment in each region and provide pastoral care and support to students and their families;
- School Nutrition Programs in 69 communities and 10 town camp regions to improve school attendance. Parents are encouraged to contribute to the costs of meals through income management. The program also provides job opportunities and training for local community members.

2. Adult education

Detailed community level information on adult education services and facilities could not be collected within the time frame.

There are a range of adult education programs for Indigenous people from the 73 prescribed communities. Some communities have training facilities/infrastructure available. The NT Government Department of Education and Training is soon to undertake a review/audit of these facilities. Some training providers use mobile training units and programs are delivered on community, in other cases students travel to an urban or regional town to undertake the course.

These programs are provided by Northern Territory or Australian government funded service providers. Many programs are responsive, ie driven by community needs; others are project based; or individuals can be referred to specific programs by service agencies and providers.

THEMIS – This Taskforce was the combined police response to the need for extra policing in the NTER communities.

4. Supporting Families (Child Protection Workers & Safe Houses or Women's Shelters)

The Family Support Package is a measure under the NT Emergency Response (NTER). The Package is jointly funded by the Australian and NT Governments. While the Australian Government has oversight of the measure, the NT Government is responsible for implementing and delivering the package in specific NT communities.

The three elements of this package are focused on Remote Aboriginal Family and Community Workers, the Mobile Child Protection unit and Safe Places respond most directly to the *Little Children are Sacred* report's overall theme of protecting Indigenous children.

A key feature of the package is to develop a coordinated Indigenous family violence management strategy for a number of Northern Territory communities based around existing services and infrastructure. Leveraging existing support services such as health facilities, schooling, police, and community service, thereby ensuring the elements of the package will provide for sustainable practices and service delivery.

Remote Aboriginal Family and Community Workers (RAFCW) Program in NTER Communities:

Eight RAFCWs have been recruited and are operational in the Northern Territory. The RAFCW are a culturally appropriate liaison and linkage point between the child-protection system, support services, Indigenous families and communities. The workers help link families with local family-safety or safe-house programs, night patrols, mental health workers and child health workers.

These workers also provide regional intelligence about child protection issues for the Mobile Child Protection Team, the NT Government and the community.

Mobile Child Protection Team

There is one Mobile Child Protection Team jointly funded by the Commonwealth and the NT Government, with up to 10 workers.

The Mobile Child Protection Team is based in Darwin and travels to remote locations as needed, to provide additional support for children. In NTER communities, the team works closely with local support services, Remote Aboriginal Family and Community Workers and police.

Safe House or Women's Shelter

Under the NTER Family Support Package there are 19 fully operational Safe Places, 11 Women's Safe Houses and 8 Men's Cooling off Places.

The Women's Traditional Safe House in Darwin is due to open by the end of June and The Omen's Safe House and Men's Cooling Off Place in Angurugu will be open shortly after.

A Safe Place is defined as operational when the doors are open and it is accepting clients.

The Women's Safe Houses each have an adult worker and a children's worker.

The Men's Cooling-off Places each have an adult worker and a youth worker.

Wherever possible a pool of casual workers is also employed to work after hours in the Safe Places.

Under the NTER Safe Place arrangements, the Northern Territory Government has the responsibility for the identification, recruitment and training of local staff in each of the Safe Places. All Safe Places are run by the Northern Territory Government.

Child Protection:

Child Protection programs and services are managed through the Northern Territory Government and encompass all of the 73 NTER communities through various means.

NT Government child protection officers are located in all major centres. The child protection workers and Aboriginal community workers in these offices deliver services to all urban and remote parts of the NT.

Child Abuse Task Force: The North Team comprises 13 NT Police Officers, 9 Australian Federal Police Officers and 5 NT Family and Community child protection workers.

The South Team comprises 5 Police officers and 3 child protection workers.
