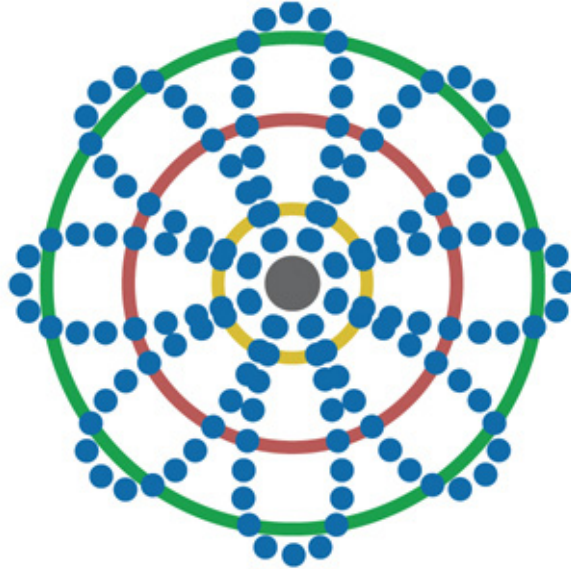

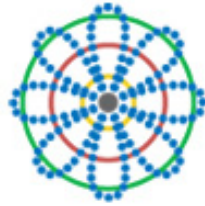

Dear Jonathon Curtis:

To the Senate and Select Committee of Indigenous Affairs, the collective are very happy to present our submission for proposing a balanced, traditional & contemporary, sustainable and corporate policy structure.

Extensive consultation with Koori Multicultural Victoria has assisted with this submission. The collective with Koori Elders, Ancestors and Community have in the past successfully completed the First Koori Multicultural Environment Group application Natural Heritage Trust 1997/98 and Australia's First Treaty © 2002/03. These effective consultations and policy submissions led and highlighted the need for the development of many government policies, programs and implementations such as the Indigenous Partnership Strategy 2001 (DNRE/DSE, Parks Victoria) and Indigenous Economic Strategy 2004 (DIIRD, Koori Business Network).

Australia's First Treaty © TM (AFT) completed since international colonisation took much time and resources to solve problems and analyse issues such as Aboriginal, Terra Nullius, genocide, stolen generation, land and spiritual rights and assimilation. Today we have United Integrated Management and Stakeholders (UIMAS) which is functioning in Indigenous law and Corporate Law. AFT effectively gave birth to the only Multicultural/Indigenous and holistic Sustainability model and system in Australia and the World. Many government and non-government organisations contributed to UIMAS & AFT © TM and the reconciliation road map. Leading the process and pathway to reconciliation through successful advocacy and negotiation amongst organisations and local individuals allowed for this historical event.

To submit UIMAS & AFT © TM as a proposal for Indigenous Affairs may be an equal partnership in Indigenous and Corporate law which could be translated and regionalised throughout sovereign countries and states of Australia. This will assist the journey of Reconciliation and Sustainability for positive change, re-industries and re-evolution and is the proper and humane initiative for employment and caring for our country.
