Classification (Publications, Films and Computer Games) Amendment (Terrorist Material) Bill 2007

On 21 June 2007, the Senate referred the provisions of the Classification (Publications, Films and Computer Games) Amendment (Terrorist Material) Bill 2007 (the Bill) to the Legal and Constitutional Affairs Committee for inquiry and report by 30 July 2007.

The Bill amends the *Classification (Publications, Films and Computer Games)* Act 1995 (the Act) to require that publications, films or computer games that advocate the doing of a terrorist act must be classified as Refused Classification. The Bill adopts the meanings of 'advocate' and 'terrorist acts' from the *Criminal Code Act 1995* by adaptation of language or direct reference.
